






Colourful Semantics Dice Nets Resource

Colourful Semantics is an approach devised by Alison Bryan.

It aims to support the development of sentence structure and grammar with the aid of colour coding. The colours used to support colourful semantics vary across the UK, these colours directly relate to the original colours set out by Alison Bryan.

There are 6 levels in total, in this resource we are using the first 3.

Who? Orange

What action? Yellow

What with? Green

This game is flexible and can be easily differentiated depending on a user's understanding and use of expressive language.

How to Play

Print out the dice and then draw or stick in the Makaton symbols or picture with words that you want to use

Cut out the dice, fold along all the edges and then glue the dice together using the 'flaps' provided. Use a filler to make dice stronger, and maybe add tape like our video.

1. Roll the orange 'who' dice to find out the subject of the story is about (the subject of the story), we used:

I, you, dad, mum, doctor, baby

2. Roll the yellow dice and find out 'what' action the subject of the story is doing, we used:

like, walk, jump, see, eat, drink

3. Roll the green dice and find out 'what' the subject is doing the action with, we used:

dinner, tree, school, flower, home. milk

Create and record your sentences, silly or sensible, enjoy!

Dad walk milk - Dad was walking on the milk - silly sentence!

Mum like flower - Mum likes the flower - sensible sentence!
